Curriculum Principles

By the end of KS2, students of Latin at Dixons Manningham will:

- Have stimulated their curiosity in learning a different language and have a sound foundation on which to build new languages on
- Have developed a range of vocabulary from ancient Latin
- Focus on developing grammar, punctuation and sentence construction, from topics related to family, food and animals
- Be able to hold a simple conversation in Latin
- Have a deeper understanding of how Latin unlocks a world of vocabulary, etymology and deeper meaning of the English language

In order to achieve a true understanding of Latin, topics will be intelligently sequenced based on the following rationale:

- The Minimus Latin scheme will be followed which have carefully planned units of work to ensure progression is built on prior learning
- Regular opportunities to practice the vocabulary are developed through discreet Latin lessons

We fully believe learning Latin can contribute to the personal development of students at DMN:

- Will develop their confidence and self-esteem when faced with an unfamiliar language
- Will gain invaluable insight into the English vocabulary, the structure and meaning of these words. They will be able to use these as a basis for learning any other language they choose in the future
- Students will have a broader view of the world with deeper understanding of ancient languages and cultures and the impact they have had on *their* world.
- Will develop their critical thinking, create keener attention to detail and enhance their problem -solving skills
- Students will co-ordinate ideas, reflect on the various ways to say the same things and thus, improve in other subjects
