English

This half term we will be reading and writing persuasive leaflets and descriptions to entertain.

Children will look at the features of these texts and learn and how to write complex sentences that are correctly punctuated.

In Reading, we will be focusing on core retrieval skills and finding the answers in the text.

Our main text is 'Anglo-Saxon Boy' and children will be expected to read this at home as part of their homework.

Maths

This half term we will be continuing to work on calculations.

Children will:

- Convert mixed numbers and improper fractions
- Order and compare fractions
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators
- Read and write decimal numbers as fractions

We will also continue to practice using the four operations in arithmetic.

Topic

Our History topic this half term will be Early Islamic Civilisation. We will be looking at the role of Baghdad, the House of Wisdom and how it became a centre for learning. We will also discover some of the significant inventions made and studies which were led by early Islamic scholars and evaluate the impact they made on the wider world. We will investigate the beginnings of the civilisation, how the first caliphate came to be formed and explain the roles and responsibilities of a caliph.

PE

Children will be learning how to create a dance sequence based on mixed martial arts. This will include jumps, leaps, hops, stretches and rolls. We will be cooperative.

Art/ DT

This half term we will learn about Islamic designs and will create clay tiles. These will have geometric patterns based on traditional techniques and will be painted in a style similar to Islamic artists.

Reminders

- ✓ All children should read for 20 minutes every night and should bring their reading book each day.
- ✓ Homework is given out on a Wednesday and is handed in on the following Monday
- ✓ Creative homework pieces can be brought in at any time
- ✓ PE Kits are needed on Tuesdays, but may be worn every day for Active learning
