English

This half term we will be learning about poetry and the language devices that can be used. Children will also be writing biographies of the Highwayman.

Children will be learning how to use a colon to introduce a list, using punctuation to mark boundaries between independent clauses and how words are related.

In addition to this, we will be practising spellings and handwriting to ensure our work is presented well. Children will also be set individual writing targets that they will be continuing to work on throughout the term.

Maths

In maths we will be focusing our learning on Fractions. Children will be learning how to:

- Use common factors to simplify fractions.
- Use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination.
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers.
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form.
- Divide proper fractions by whole numbers.

Topic

Our 'History' topic this half term will be **Crime and Punishment** and the children will be learning about different British time periods. They will be comparing and contrasting using a range of sources to find out information of the types of crimes and punishments within different time periods.

The children will also be visited by a visitor called the Highwayman. He will provide an insight into the crimes of the 18th and 19th century.

PE

This term children will be doing indoor gymnastics for PE. This will take place on Monday for all of year 6. Children will be learning how to perform complex shapes when performing sequences.

Year 6 will also take part in a daily active learning session for 15 minutes.

Children must attend in the correct PE kit, which is a white t-shirt, navy blue/grey/black tracksuit bottoms
