English

Writing: Students will explore the story One Snowy Night. We will be using the story to orally practice complete sentences. We will also be writing sentences using a full stop, capital letters and finger spaces.

Reading:

We will have daily Reading Mastery lessons, focussing on reading simple words and sentences. Look out for Reading Mastery worksheets and books in their bag. Please practice reading their books everyday.

Maths

Following White Rose Maths, students will develop place value within 10, before moving on to addition and subtraction within 10. They will build numbers using counters, cubes and tens frames. They will use number bonds to 10 and fact families to add and subtract.

Daily arithmetic will build fluency in counting on and back from any number within 10 and finding one more and one less within 10.

History/Geography

Our History focus is toys from the past. We will be Identifying old and new objects, we will be ordering toys chronologically. We will be comparing similarities and differences between new and old toys.

Science

In Body Parts and Senses, we will be identifying body parts inside and outside of the body. We will draw and label basic parts of the human body. We will explore the five senses and associated body parts.

Indoor PE- Ball Games

We will learn how to pass the ball with control and begin to learn rules for games.

Art/DT

Our focus for art is observational drawings. We will learn how to use a range of media to accentuate the difference between old and new toys.

Outdoor PE- Multi Skills

Children will cooperate, compete and challenge themselves as a team in various games.

Jigsaw/PSHE

Students will explore what helps them feel special, safe and calm in their class. They will learn what it means to belong and understand their rights and responsibilities as class members.

Music

Students will learn to maintain a steady pulse whilst singing and moving. They will begin to understand that rhythm is different from pulse.

Computing

Students will develop mouse skills and other key skills using Purple Mash tools. They will represent and interpret simple data as pictograms.

Reminders

- Students should read at home for 10 minutes each night and bring their reading book daily.
- Homework is given out on Wednesday and due the following Monday.
- Students can wear non-uniform on their Birthday.
